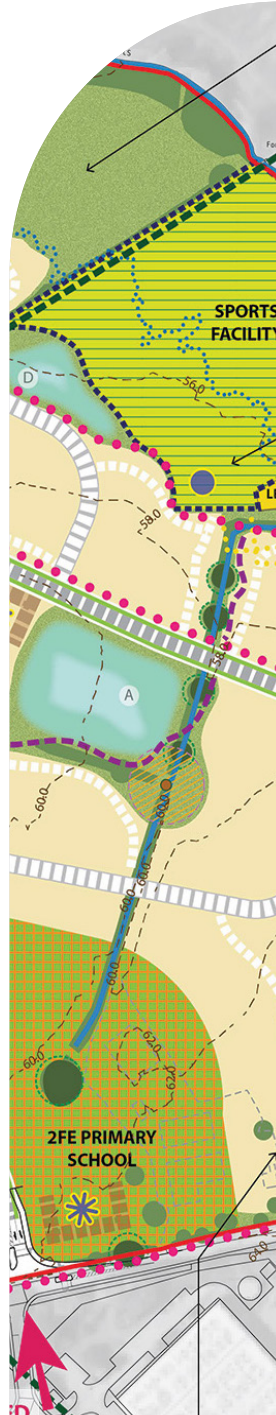

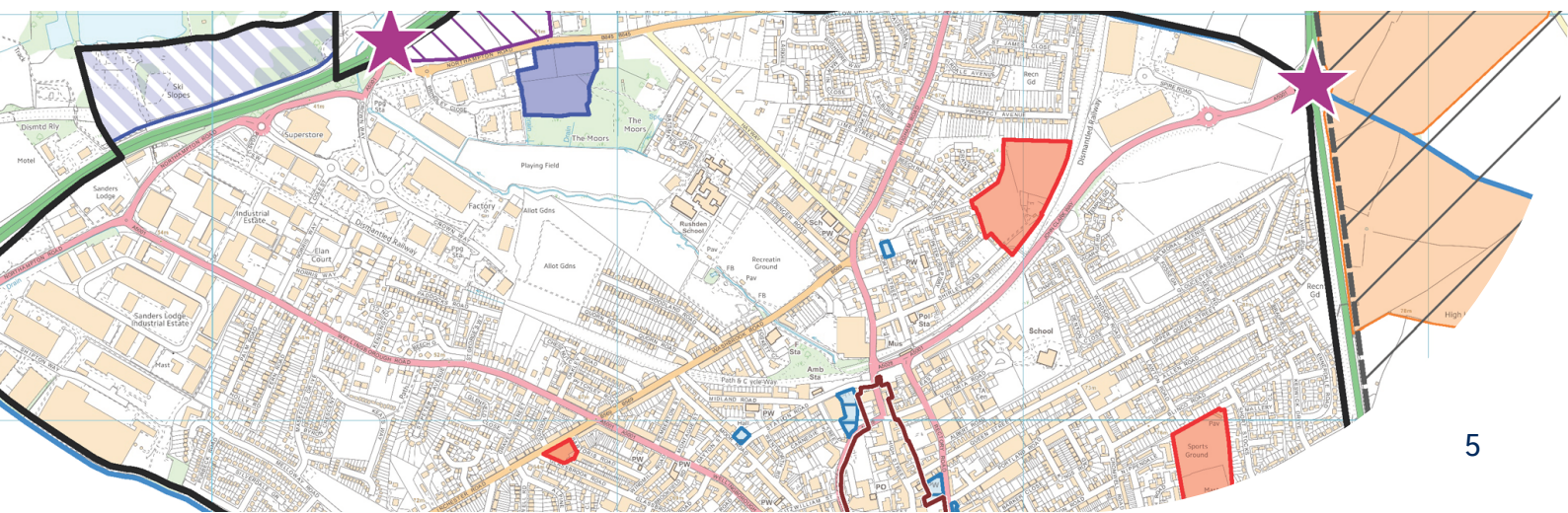
Local Plan Services

Government policy is keenly focused on achieving Local Plan coverage across England and with that, an increase in the delivery of housing. This demands a robust and sound approach to Local Plan preparation to ensure delays and modification to key parts of the Plan are avoided.

The DLP team is exceptionally experienced in plan preparation, policy writing and evidence base production, and can demonstrate a detailed understanding of what is required to support the adoption of a sound Plan.

Our broad areas of service include:

- Whole Plan Production: complete project management, policy development and consultation, topic paper preparation
- Project Management: navigating the various policy and legal requirements to ensure key deadlines are met and necessary processes are undertaken
- Vision, Strategy and Policy Advice: setting out what the Plan should achieve and confirm that the policy can achieve this

Local Plan Support – Ashfield District Council

DLP supported Ashfield District Council with the final stages of the preparation of their Local Plan, its submission and then Examination, effectively fulfilling the role of a Local Plan Manager. DLP worked closely with the Council over a 14 month period, project managing the final public consultation and submission of the Plan, the appointment of a Programme Officer and the arrangement of hearing sessions. DLP then led the preparation of responses to the Inspector's questions and responded on behalf of the Council at hearing sessions. Following the close of the hearings we assisted the Council in producing clarification statements and then, in collaboration with the Inspector, the preparation of Main Modifications.



Local Plan Support – Hastings Borough Council

DLP provided policy officer support to Hastings Borough Council in preparing their Local Plan Review. Our team advised on a range of topic areas to develop the evidence base and policy recommendations. This included preparing an updated Infrastructure Delivery Plan, undertaking a review of evidence and policy related to Houses in Multiple Occupation, preparing a Public Health Topic Paper, advising on the approach to renewable energy provision and Strategic Housing and Employment Land Availability Assessment (SHELAA), and drafting site allocations policies.

Housing Needs Study – Central Lancashire Authorities

DLP worked alongside Edge Analytics to prepare a Housing Needs Study for the Central Lancashire authorities (Chorley Council, Preston City Council, and South Ribble Borough Council) to provide evidence to inform the Joint Local Plan for the period 2023 to 2038. The report identified a series of housing need scenarios which were used to identify a total housing need figure, set housing requirements and distribution policy options for the Central Lancashire authorities. The findings and recommendations of this study were then used to inform planning policies and identify options for addressing housing needs through the Central Lancashire Joint Local Plan.



Employment Land Availability Assessment and Economic Needs Assessment – Copeland Borough Council

DLP conducted an independent Economic Development Needs Assessment (EDNA) and Employment Land Availability Study (ELAS) on behalf of Copeland Borough Council. The EDNA considered local economic development needs and growth requirements in accordance with national planning policy and guidance.

The EDNA began by assessing baseline employment data and recent commercial market trends before reviewing the Functional Economic Market Area, existing economic policies and growth indicators. As part of the assessment DLP evaluated a series of baseline jobs growth forecasts in the context of recent economic trends and market signals in order to develop a series of jobs growth scenarios. By assessing risks due to Brexit and Covid-19, and incorporating an adjustment to account for anticipated future employment land losses, the EDNA report evaluated future employment floorspace and land area requirements for each scenario and employment land use type.

The purpose of the ELAS was to identify available and achievable land for employment use that can meet the identified development needs of the Copeland Local Plan from 2021 to 2038. Each identified site was assessed based on its suitability, availability, and deliverability. The report included suggestions for allocating sites based on sustainability and site selection criteria and made recommendations for reviewing existing allocation policies and safeguarding employment land beyond the Local Plan period in key locations.



Infrastructure Plan – Derby, Derbyshire, Nottingham and Nottinghamshire LEP

On behalf of the D2N2 Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP), DLP was appointed to assess the impact of the delivery of key infrastructure projects to achieve the housing and job growth aspirations for the D2N2 area. The Infrastructure Plan collated evidence from across 19 local authority areas and other infrastructure providers, to support the economic ambitions of the LEP as defined in the Strategic Economic Plan and Local Plans of the constituent Local Planning Authorities.

Development Management Services

Many of our staff have previously worked for local authorities and we have been able to use that experience to assist Councils in the determination of pre-application enquiries, planning applications, and acting as expert witness at informal hearings and public inquiries. DLP has also acted as expert witness at planning appeals and Local Plan Examinations on behalf of other public sector bodies, including the NHS.

We have experience in using development management software such as Uniform and can integrate into Councils' management timetables and delivery schedules. Working with leading Counsel, we have appeared on behalf of Local Planning Authorities on matters of general planning, infrastructure, housing and employment need, housing and employment supply and gypsy and traveller matters.

Major Project Support – North Northamptonshire Council

DLP was appointed to process a major cross-boundary application for a sustainable urban extension at Priors Hall Park, Corby. DLP liaised with statutory consultees, Design Review Panels and the applicant in its role in assessing the application and wrote and presented the committee report to the Planning Committee. DLP was also engaged in negotiating the complex S106 agreement.

We have assisted the Council in the determination of other major residential, renewable and agricultural applications, all of which involved resolving difficult issues, negotiating S106 agreements and presenting applications to the Planning Committee.

Appeals and Public Inquiry Support – West Northamptonshire Council

DLP has supported West Northamptonshire Council in a number of S78 planning appeals on matters related to housing land supply, the relevant five-year housing requirement, and addressing the distribution of growth in adopted policies in the Joint Core Strategy. We worked closely with the Council and appointed Counsel, project managed the process, corresponded with the appellant and the Planning Inspectorate and prepared briefing notes for Counsel.

The NPPF makes the demonstration of a 5-year housing land supply (5YHLS) more onerous for the Local Planning Authority, and our work helped the Council demonstrate a significantly more robust approach to calculating land supply. As part of this process, we assisted the Council as critical friend in preparing the next update of its 5YHLS. DLP has undertaken similar work for Babergh, Mid-Suffolk and Chichester Councils.



Development Management Support – Kent Local Authorities

DLP acted as framework consultant to Maidstone Borough Council providing development management support, acting as Case Officer for planning applications to ensure the Council continued to meet its performance standards. We have also recently undertaken this role for Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council. Our experience of a wide variety of development types and scales has enabled us to handle and determine a wide variety of applications submitted to the Councils and provide a professional and responsive service.

Appeal Support – Wiltshire Council

DLP supported Wiltshire Council at Inquiry by giving planning evidence in a major case, which was refused at Planning Committee against Officer recommendation. DLP produced the Statement of Case and Proof of Evidence, working alongside the Council's planning and legal teams to ensure that the appellants claims for costs against the Council were rejected by the Planning Inspector.

Redevelopment of Public Assets

Local Authorities and other public bodies are encouraged by the Government to dispose of surplus and underutilised sites at best value. Such assets can also make a significant contribution to meeting other Council objectives such as delivery of housing (including affordable housing), providing accommodation for the elderly, and meeting wider regeneration goals. DLP has a proven track record of helping public bodies to secure planning permission for the re-development of redundant and underused assets for public benefit.

Teviot Avenue, Thurrock

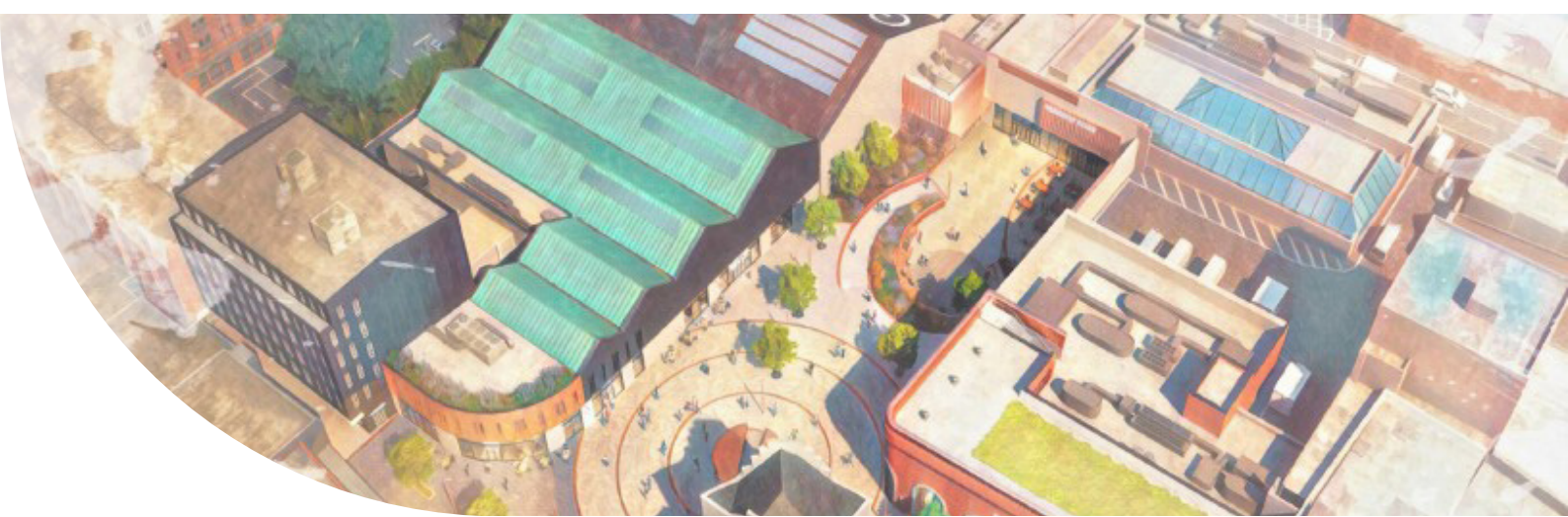
DLP was appointed as lead planning consultant on behalf of Thurrock Council's Housing Development Team, to replace three existing residential blocks consisting of 36 two-bedroom units with a new development providing 48 high-quality 100% affordable dwellings, with associated landscaping, parking and biodiversity enhancements.

Demolishing the existing inefficient buildings will allow for the construction of a development which seeks to increase the local housing supply with an affordable, high-quality mix of dwellings, available under the affordable rent tenure.

As part of the application process DLP provided comprehensive planning consultancy services through from RIBA Stage 2 to a decision from the Local Planning Authority and, provided Health Impact and Economic Impact Assessments to support the proposals. In July 2024, Thurrock's Planning Committee resolved to grant planning permission for the re-development, at which DLP made representations on behalf of the applicant.

NHS Health Hub, Sheffield City Centre

DLP instructed to provide planning services as part of wider project team in relation to a new City Centre Health Hub in Sheffield. Acting on behalf of Sheffield City Council, an application for listed building consent and planning permission was submitted for the new hub, which will be operated by two NHS GPs. The work involved the conversion of an existing building, formerly an RBS bank, now owned by the Council. This building is Grade II listed and within the City Centre Conservation Area, and therefore the heritage value of the premises was a key consideration as well as the obvious public benefits of the proposals. Various amendments and discharge of condition applications were required, and DLP's involvement is ongoing. Due to the Council's ownership, all applications were submitted as Regulation 3 applications. This involved working closely with the NHS and Sheffield City Council, as well as the wider design team, to ensure an acceptable proposal, appropriate for the end users.



Freshney Place, Grimsby

DLP played a leading role in obtaining planning permission for the regeneration of Freshney Place in the heart of Grimsby town centre. Working as part of the project team, on behalf of North East Lincolnshire Council, the Regulation 3 application was approved in February 2023 having received a resolution to grant at Planning Committee. The project will create a new market and food hall, new commercial spaces, a new cinema, and a new leisure use building. Significant improvements will also be made to the public realm as part of the project. The project is a unique opportunity to diversify and enhance the vitality of the town centre, and to promote inward investment to strengthen the local economy. DLP's role in the application included management and undertaking of pre-application discussions with officers; involvement in the public consultation event; preparation of the EIA Screening Request, Planning Statement, Heritage Statement, and Statement of Community Involvement; project management through the application process; and presentation of the scheme to the Planning Committee.

Affordable Homes Programme, London Borough of Newham

Since May 2019 DLP has been advising the London Borough of Newham Strategic Regeneration Department and the Housing Delivery Team on the development of eight Council owned sites, as part of the Council's Affordable Homes for Newham Programme.

The project was in response to the Mayor of Newham's pledge to provide 1,000 new Council-owned homes at social rent levels by May 2022. These eight schemes (Chargeable Lane, Idmiston Road, Bramhall Close, David Street, Anne Street, Forest View Road, Malmesbury Terrace and Landseer Avenue) vary in size from 3 to 27 units and are the first sites to come forward for development as part of the programme. Two of the schemes (Chargeable Lane and Idmiston Road) were granted planning permission at Planning Committee on December 2019 and the remaining six sites were approved at Committee in February 2020. These first eight schemes will provide 99 new high-quality homes at London Affordable Rent.

All of these sites are currently occupied by garages, non-residential uses or parking areas. They are within the Council's ownership, and are located within existing residential areas but typically constrained in terms of proximity to other properties and daylight/sunlight. The schemes will provide 100% affordable housing and a minimum of 39% family units.

Following the successful completion of these schemes, DLP was instructed to assist with taking several more sites through the planning process.

Forest Edge South Neighbourhood Plan – West Dean Parish Council

DLP was appointed by West Dean Parish Council to provide assistance with preparing their Neighbourhood Plan. This work involved undertaking an initial policy scoping exercise and evidence gathering, including a local housing needs survey and evidence to support the allocation of Local Green Spaces. We then worked with the Steering Group to prepare the draft Neighbourhood Plan which was published for consultation. Following consultation we assisted the Steering Group with the review of consultation responses and advised on amendments to the Neighbourhood Plan. We prepared submission documents including the Public Consultation statement and Basic Conditions Statement. The Plan successfully passed its referendum in 2024.

Rushden Neighbourhood Plan – Rushden Town Council

DLP was instructed by Rushden Town Council to manage the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan. DLP was involved in all aspects of the plan-making process. This included evidence gathering, SEA screening, undertaking a 'Call for Sites' and targeted land searches with recommendations on potential allocations, plan drafting, producing supporting documents and a Policies Map. DLP was also closely involved with the public exhibition events, analysing the responses received and preparing a Consultation Statement and Basic Conditions Statement to show how the Plan met the tests of national policy.

Throughout the process DLP worked closely with the Town Council maintaining regular contact with Members and the Planning Group to offer advice on legislative requirements and the practical application of policy. The Neighbourhood Plan was 'made' following a referendum in which 85% of the votes cast were in favour. The Neighbourhood Plan was commended by the Examiner as being a 'clear and concise, locally distinct [and] coherent policy document' and has since been applied in practice.



Skegness Neighbourhood Plan – Skegness Town Council

DLP assisted with developing the, Neighbourhood Plan, including undertaking a public consultation exercise to identify key local issues and develop an overarching vision and objectives for the draft Plan. DLP worked with the Steering Group to prepare policies to achieve the town's vision and objectives and guide its development until 2031. Aligning with the strategic policies of the adopted Local Plan, the policies within the Neighbourhood Plan were developed to promote the wellbeing and livelihood of current and future residents and visitors, whilst preserving and enhancing the town's character and the wider coastal environment.

In support of the Neighbourhood Plan DLP also undertook a Site Identification and Assessment Exercise, Parking Assessment and Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating Strategic Environmental Assessment), as well as preparing submission documents including a Public Consultation Statement, Basic Conditions Statement and responding to Examiner questions. The Plan successfully passed its referendum and was 'made' in May 2023.

Transport & Infrastructure Services

Construction Traffic Management Plans – London Borough of Newham

The Transport & Infrastructure team prepared ten bespoke Construction Traffic Management Plans (CTMPs) to support separate planning applications for the redevelopment of Council assets on behalf of the London Borough of Newham. These CTMPs included details of construction vehicle routing, vehicle quanta, worker parking, construction compounds and details on hours of permitted operation and delivery.

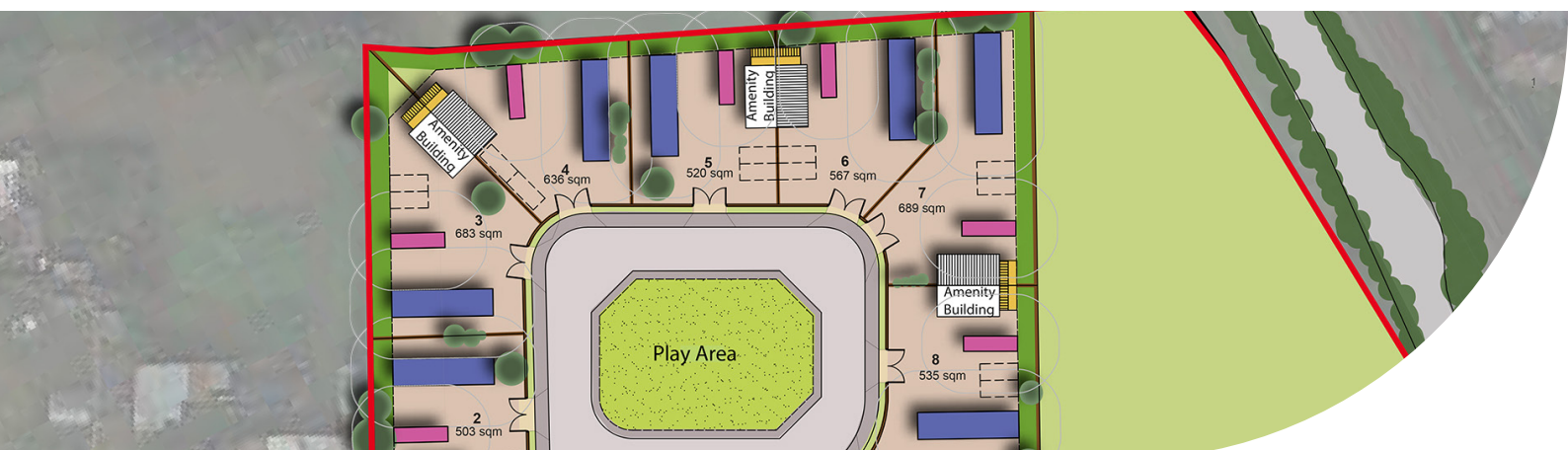
In addition to this, the Transport & Infrastructure team worked closely with the London Borough of Newham Development Services and Newham Highways Officers to agree the principles of the CTMPs and in particular, where Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders were required to implement temporary parking restrictions and relocate pedestrian routes to ensure the efficient and safe operation of the construction sites during the main build out periods.



Gypsy & Traveller & Travelling Showpeople Development Plan Support – Mansfield District Council

The Transport & Infrastructure team worked closely with Mansfield District Council in refining their site options for the delivery of gypsy, traveller and travelling showpeople land for inclusion in their emerging Local Plan. The work included a high-level review of 17 initial site options and assessment of the deliverability and suitability of these sites in terms of connections to and the accessibility of local facilities, the surrounding road network and overall deliverability of the sites. This work included the preparation of a site assessment scoring scheme to refine the site selection process.

Following this initial work the Transport & Infrastructure team undertook a detailed assessment of the six remaining sites which included site access design, vehicle swept path analysis, a review of potential trip generation and the suitability of surrounding access routes to accommodate larger vehicle movements.



Highways Support – Tees, Esk and Wear Valley NHS Foundation Trust

Recent key schemes include work undertaken for the NHS Tees, Esk and Wear Valley Foundation Trust, providing transport planning (Transport Assessment and Travel Plan) support for proposals to develop new mental health hubs. Such work has also involved providing wider advice to the NHS in terms of their planning application and direct liaison with both the Local Planning Authority and Local Highway Authority in order to reach an agreed position.

Design Code and Landscape Masterplan Preparation – Wigan Council

DLP was appointed by Wigan Council to prepare a Design Code for King Street within the historic heart of Wigan town centre. Our team led the community engagement with local business owners and residents with face-to-face meetings, virtual interviews and informal ‘drop-in’ sessions. Our output was an easy to understand document which would help applicants when preparing their planning applications and the Local Authority in determining them.

DLP continued the appointment with Wigan Council to prepare a masterplan for King Street. This included the preparation of a Public Realm Strategy with Landscape Masterplan proposals for the pedestrianised areas of the Masterplan. The Landscape Masterplan sought to introduce materials and planting to improve the quality of the public realm within this historic core. The proposals defined the vehicular accessible areas and loading bays and created new places for people to pause and sit in a more pleasant environment.



Concept Development, Planning Permission and Delivery – Merseyside Fire and Rescue Service

DLP worked with Merseyside Fire and Rescue Service to create a multi-use community hub which provided the necessary fire services and also integrated sport, education and leisure facilities, including a 1,500 seater sports hall, gymnasium, martial arts and dance studios, sports pitches and cafe and activity rooms.

This allowed the facility to serve many purposes, improving the sustainability of the building and allowing the community to come together.

Delivery Framework Preparation – Milton Keynes Development Partnership

Our team worked with Milton Keynes Development Partnership to prepare an outline planning application for 45ha of land at Tickford Farm, to the north-east of Newport Pagnell. The site forms part of a strategic growth area for Milton Keynes, delivering a new local centre and approximately 1,000 new homes along with expansive public open space and amenity space. We worked closely with the wider to deliver a Masterplan which met with the client’s ambition and provided a deliverable proposal.
